COMMENTS: ■ Domestic Violence Awareness Month Proclamation – Mayor read the proclamation – **Mayor** - This is the Cedar City Utah Proclamation. Whereas in the United States October is recognized as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. The goal of DVAM is to raise public awareness about domestic violence and educate communities on how to prevent it. Whereas one in three women and one in five men in Utah will experience stalking, physical or sexual abuse from an intimate partner a statistic that does not include those that experience verbal and emotional abuse from an intimate partner. Whereas Canyon Creek Services is a local non-profit advocacy organization that provides free confidential services to survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault as well as community education and prevention programming. Last physical year CCS served 739 survivors. The need to prevent domestic violence in our area is evident.
